Mary is Mother of Church

Mary is Jesus's Mom and was with Jesus at the cross
Mary is completely without sin, and was assumed into Heaven body and soul.
Pray to Mary and Saints because they are in Heaven with God
We are part of a large Church (living and dead)

Communion of Saints includes every-one—living, in purgatory and in heaven equals the body of Christ

Rosary Mysteries:
Joyful, Luminous, Sorrowful, Glorious
Four Marian Dogmas
1. Mother of God
2. Perpetual Virginity
3. Immaculate Conception
4. The Assumption
Difference between Incarnation (Jesus) and Immaculate Conception (Mary)

intercession - ask saints for help to pray to God; we don't pray to saints instead of God
Dogmas - Truth God has revealed
Church Militant—those living on earth
Church Suffering—those in purgatory
Church Triumphant—those in heaven (saints)
